

## God's Perpetual Supply.

Shalom,

The Torah portions found in Leviticus 25:1—27:34 are of great importance, and contain wonderful promises to those who will trust in them. These were words from the Father to the Children of Israel instructing them to observe **Sabbath years for the land** when they entered into the land of promise. They were to sow their fields and prune their vines so that they might **gather the fruit for six years**, but He instructed them to neither sow, prune, nor gather during the seventh year. In other words, they were to let the land completely rest. If we think about it, we might ask how this could possibly work out. Our minds generally think in terms of the natural, and that can, and has gotten many of us into trouble. It is recorded for us that the Lord knew these questions would arise, for the following Scripture is given.

*Leviticus 25:20 And if ye shall say, **What shall we eat the seventh year? behold, we shall not sow, nor gather in our increase:***

People living today that pay too much attention to news channels are asking questions similar to the one quoted above. What will we eat? What will we drink? What will we wear? Who hasn't heard, and maybe even spoken of "**These difficult economic times?**" We often adopt **the expressions of the world**, and if we don't guard our hearts with the Word of God, we slip into the despair and discouragement that cloud our understanding, and lead to a departure from the Teaching and Instruction of the Living God.

We believe that our Father is a Loving God Who has given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness through the knowledge of Him (2 Peter 1:3), and that He Who didn't spare His own Son, Yeshua the Messiah, but delivered Him up for us all, then we know, that through Him, He will freely give us all things (Romans 8:32). We can depend upon our God to take care of us, and all of our needs, even when His instructions contradict natural knowledge. The natural man says, "If I don't plant for one whole year, there will be a shortage and I will starve." The man who lives in the Spirit will understand that every Word of God is true, and His wisdom is perfect. We can only imagine how wonderfully the land would produce if Gods' Word were fully obeyed, and I am certain that there would be no shortages. Our God knows how to bless those who will hear His Voice. He is surely **El Shaddai**, the more-than-enough God. His sufficiency is never ending. With His Word He calls forth, and the very elements of creation all obey Him.

*Leviticus 25:21 Then **I will command My blessing upon you in the sixth year, and it shall bring forth fruit for three years.***

*Leviticus 25:22 And ye shall sow the eighth year, and **eat yet of old fruit until the ninth year; until her fruits come in ye shall eat of the old store.***

The wisdom of the world infects the minds of those who esteem human logic and practicality above the Word of God. Don't allow your mind to develop in the ways of the natural so that you begin to think as the world thinks. Natural thinking brings about the notion that if we are going to

have success in life, we will have to put our wants and desires ahead of the needs and concerns of others, and heap up things so that we won't run out. The enemy's plans to thwart the plan of God are to get us to rely upon natural knowledge so that we hold back that which is to be dedicated to God, whether it be our time, our talent, or our tithe.

*1 Corinthians 2:14 But **the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God:** for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.*

**Instead**, we must hear and follow God's instructions, being confident of His care and provision for us.

*Philippians 4:8 (TLV) <sup>8</sup> Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable—if there is any virtue and if there is anything worthy of praise—dwell on these things.*

*Philippians 4:19 (TLV) <sup>19</sup> My God will fulfill every need of yours according to the riches of His glory in Messiah Yeshua.*

*Colossians 3:15 ...**let the peace of God rule in your hearts**, to the which also ye are called in one body; and **be ye thankful.***

*Colossians 3:16 **Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom;** teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord.*

*Colossians 3:17 **And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the Name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by Him.***

You may be assured that, as you live to keep and fulfill His Word, **God has commanded His blessing upon you. You will be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, in the Name of Yeshua.**

*Leviticus 26:9-10 (MSG) <sup>9</sup> I'll give you My full attention: I'll make sure you prosper, make sure you grow in numbers, and keep My covenant with you in good working order. <sup>10</sup> You'll still be eating from last year's harvest when you have to clean out the barns to make room for the new crops.*
